#### **OBJECTIVES**

#### FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Throughout the program, the fellow will develop a deep understanding of an assigned therapeutic area by engaging in projects that enable them to analyze, develop, and deliver scientifically-balanced data to HCPs while focusing on improving patient outcomes. The first year's focus on core competencies establishes a foundational understanding of Medical Affairs by rotating through three core groups. The second year may involve an elective rotation that gives exposure to one department outside of Medical Affairs and a specific focus to one group within.


