Publications and Presentations

Dr. Katherine Hazen, Assistant Program Director of NU's Public Evaluation Lab (NU-PEL), had an article published in the journal *Family Court Review* titled "The Children's Justice Clinic: Ensuring high-quality legal representation for children through clinical legal education." The article, <u>linked here</u>, presents the results from the evaluation of a clinic that integrates classroom teaching, clinical legal practice, multidisciplinary expert consultation, and reflective practice to train practice-ready Guardians ad Litem.

Dr. John Olawepo, an IHESJR Faculty Scholar, had an article published in the *Tropical Medicine and Health* journal titled "Immune response to hepatitis B vaccine among children under 5 years in Africa: a meta-analysis." This article explored the estimated HBV vaccine seroprotection rate and the associated factors among under-five children who completed a primary series of HBV vaccination in Africa. Institute News and Updates

Congratulations to Dr. John Olawepo for being selected as this year's Bouvé Distinguished Educator Award in the Undergraduate Educator category by The Bouvé Faculty Development and Recognition Committee! Dr. Olawepo was nominated for this award by his students, which showcases the positive impact students experience in response to his teaching.

Dr. Amantia Ametaj, a research scientist at IHESJR, was recently honored by the Psychiatric Genomic Consortium (PGC) Africa for her work around building capacity in scientific writing for early career researchers in Africa. She co-led a training program, in connection with a large study on schizophrenia and bipolar disorder in Ethiopia, Kenya, South Africa, and Uganda, where she mentored 13 junior researchers, primarily psychiatrists, in analyzing data from the study and writing academic papers. The program has led to 11 first-author publications by African collaborators to date.

Congratulations to Dr. Lorraine Lacroix-Williamson and Dr. Samantha Meeker from the Population Health PhD program, who will be entering new full-time roles soon. Dr. Lacroix-Williamson will work as a Sexual and Reproductive Health Epidemiologist at the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. Dr. Meeker will work at Loyola University Chicago as a tenure-track assistant professor of epidemiology for the Parkinson School of Health Sciences and Public Health.

Congratulations to Christian Herrera, Lab Coordinator for the CHANGE Lab, for getting into a Clinical Psychology Ph.D. program! He will be attending the University of Missouri, Columbia starting in August 2024.
